Word from Fr. Louie

Our reading from Ezekiel this week concentrates on what is fair. The prophet can be confusing because we see wrongdoers getting earthly rewards all of the time. And we see good, virtuous people with bad luck. The thing about prophets is that they are talking about what is going to happen. With hindsight we know that Ezekiel is prophesying about heavenly rewards: life in heaven. Jesus tells the temple authorities that tax collectors and prostitutes will go to heaven before them. Pretty strong stuff. But they did not accept the truth from John the Baptist. Even when they saw notorious sinners changing their ways because of John, they still did not. The warning is that we have to be open to God's will. We have to be willing to admit when we are wrong and accept that we have not been following God's will. God loves us and will forgive us: we have to be aware that we need to be forgiven and amend our ways.
